HOW DO WE KNOW WE'RE WINNING?

WHO AM I?

Place a name tag on everyone's back as they come in the door with a famous person's name on it (a well-known music artist, athlete, actor, book or movie character, biblical person, etc.). Have everyone ask yes/no questions of each other until they can guess whose name is on their back. Give extra clues to anyone who is stuck for too long.

THE VEGETABLE GAME.

Go around the circle and have each person say the name of a vegetable without letting their teeth show as they speak by keeping their lips curled over their teeth. No repeats. Keep going around until you can't think of any more vegetables or people expire from laughter.

I LIKE/YOU LIKE.

Take turns going clockwise around the circle each saying something you like. It could be a food, an activity, a place, a movie, a book, a game, a music artist, an actor, something people do, etc. This will often generate discussion, with others who feel the same or feel differently speaking up. Go around the circle a few times without repeating any items. You could keep it as simple as that, or you could add complexity by then going counterclockwise around the circle and trying to say something that the person on your right previously said they like!

TRUE FOR YOU

Objective: Find something you have in common with someone else so you can sit in their spot.

- Gather a loose circle of seats so there's a spot for everyone to sit except you.
- Have everyone else sit down while you stand in the middle of the circle.
- Explain that you will say something that is true for you, and then everyone else for whom the statement is also true will need to switch seats immediately
- When people get up to move, you try to sit in someone's spot.
- Whoever is left without a chair stands in the middle and makes the next true statement about themselves. It can be anything true that you can't tell by looking at them
- You'll learn what things various people in the group have in common, and you'll get people laughing and active.



GROWTH IS MOVEMENT

SERVE

- · DISCOVER YOUR GOD-GIVEN SHAPE FOR SERVING
- SERVE IN THE CHURCH AND COMMUNITY

SHARE

We boldly share the story of what God has done in our lives in order to invite others to "Come and See" that life is better with Jesus.

- · Is your group open to visitors?
- Who in your lives and the lives of your group members needs to simply be invited?

PRAY

We engage in 2 way communication regularly with our Lord and King (speaking and listening).

There are many ways to pray, but you can try this structure with your group

PRAISE

Thank God for who He is, and what He's done.

REPENT

Be real with God and talk to Him about your struggles

ASK

Talk to God about how you need his help.

YIELD

Sit with God and Listen to Him

GROUPS ARE NOT A PLACE FOR:

- BUSINESS keep this setting about relationships
- OFFERINGS no burden on you as a leader, we have benevolence process
- THERAPY You are not expected to fix anyone's problems. Set boundaries and know when to refer.
- CONTROVERSIAL TOPICS stay unified, keep Jesus at the center, use the authority you have as a leader to steer the conversation in the right direction.

- 6:30 Guests arrive and socialize

- 7:15 Discuss Group Expectations
- 7:30 Study/Discussion
- 8:15 Prayer requests/prayer
- 8:25 Housekeeping and dismissal

TIPS FOR A GREAT FIRST GATHERING

- · Snacks, food, or some drinks can set a casual one.
- · Get to know each other first and foremost

SET EXPECTATIONS:

- Respect others
- No gossip/slander



You'll be assigned a coach to help you along your journey as a group leader and connect you to other group leaders who are figuring it out.

- Boss

YOUR COACH IS A:

- Support
- Encouragement
- Resource
- · Problem Solver

GETTING THE MOST OUT OF YOUR COACH

- **RESPOND** They can't help if you don't answer the phone.
- TRUST They want to help, so be vulnerable and real!
- **ASK QUESTIONS** You don't have to solve problems on your own.

WHEN TO REFER

You're not expected to solve everyone's problems or be anyone's therapist. Please reach out to your coach or Groups Pastor when a group member:

- Is struggling with mental, physical, or emotional issues that are dominating group time.
- Is talking about harming themselves or others or engaging in illegal activity.
- Has a financial or material need that is going unmet we may be able to help or connect them with resources.

If there is an immediate threat to a member's health, call 911 before your coach.



GROUPFINDER

Interactive tool that allows users to select from among all open small groups and visit the group that meets their needs.



DO:

- Write a clear, informative group description.
- You will receive an email for each person who signs up for your group. It's important that you Reach out to them within 48 hours by call or text to give welcome them and give them basic information about your group.
- Keep your listing Current and up to date.

DON'T:

- Include your personal address or contact info in the description.
- · Include ordering details for any required resources.



HOW BIG SHOULD MY GROUP BE?

For most small groups 8-12 regular attenders is the sweet spot between big enough for community and small enough that everyone has a voice. The exception would be certain types of interest groups.

WHERE AND WHEN SHOULD MY GROUP MEET?

Homes are usually the best as long as the atmosphere is able to be welcoming and accommodating. When that is not possible meet in a home consider an alternate place in the community (i.e. park, coffee shop, bar).

CAN MY GROUP MEET AT CHURCH?

Homes and the community are the preferred meeting spot, but there may be spaces at our campuses during Find Your People initiatives. Speak to your coach or Groups Pastor.

WHAT SHOULD WE DO ABOUT KIDS?

There are several creative ways to handle childcare for your small group. Some groups share the expense of a sitter each week. Other groups will assign a designated "point person" within the group to be the go to person for kids. Consider hosting an online group to alleviate some of the burden of childcare. Affordable childcare may be offered for on campus groups during "Find Your People" initiatives.

HOW CAN I DECIDE WHAT CONTENT TO DISCUSS?

Spend some time getting to know your people and what they are interested in along with what struggles they're facing. Dig into RighnowMedia or ask your coach for recommendations that align with those interests.
